Children to be reminded not to leave lanes area without permission. Toilet breaks as required Ensure everyone uses facilities prior to an event, and is aware that toilet permission is required and only leave in pairs/or singly with supervision permission. Permission slips have details of Adult who is allowed to take child home, together with emergency contact number	

Lack of supervision or lack of attention		Ensure Adult to child ratio is adequate for the task being supervised,	
Disruptive behaviour	All	<p>Ensure adequate supervision of participants not engaged in activity. Activity to be appropriate for participants' age range and ability. Clear instructions and rules to be given for activity</p> <p>Young People not to use arcade machines without adult supervision</p>	
Use of the Facility Equipment or Activity	All	<p>Covered by the Staff and internal control measures. The facility Staff assumes responsibility for the paying customers Health and Safety and will have First Aid equipment. It is the Leaders responsibility to ensure children follow those rules by observation and intervention only when deemed necessary.</p> <p>Ramps to be used and adults to assist with the lifting and placement of the balls by younger age groups</p>	
Fire/Emergencies	All	Follow instructions of Centre staff to ensure children are safely taken to meeting point and remain under control of leaders. Leader in Charge to make contact with adults using information from permission slips
